Due to Extreme Fire Danager, 50 BMG is NOT allowed at HESA, Pistol Bays or Rose-Iris Range until further notice.

ATTENTION ALL RSOs: When exiting or entering the Main Gate, please make sure the gate closes behind you. There is about a 30 second delay on the sensor and we have had non-members driving in through the gate when someone has just driven off without ensuring that the gate has closed.

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

Registration for our **August 10** evaluation for students who have completed the Online Course opened on July 22. We will also



As Fall approaches, classes get harder to find and usually fill up quickly so you may have to travel farther to get into a class that fits your schedule. **The August and September Classes will be the last ones we offer in 2024**.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it was loaded, control the direction of the muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and avoid alcoholic beverages before and during shooting.

ADVANTAGES OF BEING A RSO

To become a TCSA RSO, you need to have and maintain your TCSA Membership, complete an 8-hour Class and volunteer to stand 3 days per year at the Rose-Iris General Purpose Range on a Wednesday, Friday, Saturday or Sunday. You choose which of those three days you will be able to meet.

The advantages of being a RSO and obligating yourself as a volunteer at TCSA means that on days when the Range is not open to the general public - YOU - as a RSO can use the Range. Having gone through the RSO Training Class and volunteering your time you are able to go to the Range any time you like!

We will sponsor an Event for young shooters at the Hunter Education Safety Association Range **Saturday, August 24**, starting at 9:00 a.m.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND: Youth aged 10 to 18 and their adult supervisors.

The event is designed for youth who:

* Are already familiar with firearms handling and safety protocols

* Understand the concepts of sight picture and trigger control

*Are interested in participating in organized shooting sports events

*May wish to become members of a sport shooting club

*Can attend accompanied by an adult supervisor

This is **not an Event designed for non-shooters or beginning shooters.** We will plan subsequent events to prepare beginners for participation in shooting sports.

NATURE OF THE EVENT: This Event will be limited to .22 rimfire rifles. Either metallic or telescopic sights are welcome. Shooters may bring their own family's firearms and ammunition. TCSA loaner rifles and ammunition will also be available. Eye and ear protection is required and will be available on loan if you do not have your own.

THE EVENT WILL INCLUDE:

*A safety briefing.

*A course of fire at paper targets at set distances of 25 and 50 yards.

*An opportunity to observe the Cowboy Action Shooting and the 3 Gun Match which will be held in the pistol bays.

*A discussion period for youth to express their interests in firearms and shooting sports and for adults to provide input on desired events

*A drawing for a RMSF hat.

RECREATION CONSERVATION OFFICE (RCO) VISIT

On Thursday July 25 the **Recreation Conservation Office Board** toured the Tri Cities Shooting Association facilities. The RCO is responsible for providing grants to firearms facilities. The TCSA has received several grants over the years. We received assistance for the Shotgun Facility, the Hunter Education and Safety Range, Rose-Iris paving and range house expansion. They also provided funding for the road to High-Power.

During their visit we provided them with a demonstration of the Trap and Skeet Ranges. **Stu Bruce** and **Mike Inglima** demonstrated Trap and **Phil Volkman** and **Rich Poehls** demonstrated Skeet.

The board members were very impressed with range and facilities that we have received RCO funding. We are currently using RCO funding for a new **Smallbore Range** and recently completed the Rose-Iris parking lot paving project.

A new grant cycle is beginning soon and the TCSA will be looking at projects that might be eligible for a grant.

HIGH-POWER

Summer is most assuredly here. Just in case you haven't noticed the smoke or all the news articles about the whole state being on fire, I will throw out the standard warning about being fire safe. **Stay on the gravel roads, follow the ammo requirements and use common sense**. While you are using that common sense about the fire hazard, use it on your own needs too, **keep hydrated, don't forget the sunscreen, etc.**

Schedule wise for August it is pretty Smallbore heavy. On the Centerfire side of things, we have got a reduced yardage across the course match on **August 31** and that is it. For Smallbore we have got a **50/100 Yard Dewar Match** on **August 6**, a **Vintage Smallbore** on **August 8**, a **50 Yard USBR** on the **13th**, a **50 Yard ARA** on the **15th**, a **100/200 Yard Smallbore** on the **17th**, a **PR 22** on the **18th** and a **100 Yard Mini-Palma** on the **27th**. For all you **High-Power RSOs** out there, there are 5 Fridays, 3 Saturdays and 3 Sundays in August with nothing on the schedule. The Range is all yours, do not forget to sign in and pay your day use fee.

Looking back at the past month, we had a 2-day Match at the end of June. As predicted the big winner was the state junior coach **Michael Storer** on Saturday. Sunday saw Michael win again, but Vancouver BC's **Michael Park** took home the 6 leg points toward his Distinguished Rifleman badge. For both the July 13th **V2 Points Series Match** and the July 14th **Reduced Yardage Match**, turnout was low enough due to the 3-digit temperatures that both were declared a practice and no scores were recorded. So, I guess that means if you showed up and survived or if you stayed home in the AC, consider yourself a winner!

On the Smallbore side, we had a **Smallbore Dewar** on July 2. Excellent shooting was on display with all competitors posting aggregate scores better than 90%. Match winner was **Brandon Tinker** with a 38-33x. **Mike Bunch** and **Glen Buxton** ran an X-count race for 2nd with Mike edging out Glen with a 397-30x over a 397-28x respectively.

For the July 4 Vintage Smallbore Match, the weather was just about ideal and the July 4th Holiday allowed several folks who don't normally shoot this Match to come out. Welcome! There were many excellent scores, with Glen Buxton, Russ Hammond, Sean Reffalt and Phil Smith all shooting clean raw scores on both targets. But the shooters final places highlight the tactical decision between shooting iron sights vs scopes (with a -3 point/ card handicap) in this Match. Glen Buxton won the Match with a score of 400-28X and Mike Bunch won the high card score with 200-17X. For the July 9 **USBR Match**, conditions were just about ideal again, with temperatures in the mid 70°F's and breezes just about nil. **Ben Cook** had a standout day, posting the high card so far this year and setting a new all-time record for this Match by 1 point and 8X's with a 488-18x! Congratulations Ben!

At the July 11 **ARA Match**, Rattlesnake Mountain Shooting Facility winds returned to form for the monthly non-sanctioned ARA Match. With winds swirling between 5-13 MPH, and a high gust of 17 MPH, most shooters had the common sense to remain at home. **Mike Bunch** cruised to an easy win, with a high card of 2150-9X and an aggregate of 4125-15X.

And finally, the July 23 **Mini-Palma Match** was attended by twelve shooters including one junior. The wind was mild and shooters came up with great scores. **John Julian** shot a perfect score of 450 and 35 X's. John was followed closely by **Tom Walchuck** and **Jack Smith** with scores of 449-36x and 449-30x respectively.

Happy dog days of summer everyone. I am not sure I know exactly what that means, or if I am using that saying correctly, but it sure seems to fit with the weather we are currently having. Try to stay cool out there these next couple of weeks.

I usually wait until the end of the Shotgun Report to bestow the **"The Hero Volunteer of the Month"**, but this month is a little different. Longtime Shotgun member **Ron Geiger** passed away the last weekend of July. Ron had stepped away from his usual weekly appearances a few months back due to some health issues he was facing. Ron was 83 years old and will be missed by so many of us.

Services will be held on Tuesday, August 6 at Einan's Funeral Home. There will be a Rosary at 11:00 a.m., with services at 11:30 a.m.

Ron has been a staple of the Shotgun Range for a lot of years. He would tell me about coming out to shoot when it was just the old shack and everything was mostly dirt. Ron was there through all of the amazing improvements we all currently enjoy at the Range. Ron took it upon himself to be the keeper of the lawns at the Range. He would spend hours upon hours adjusting sprinklers to make sure dry spots were kept to a minimum. Picking up target chips off of the Skeet fields, sweeping the sidewalks next to the houses, emptying garbage cans, hauling firewood to Skeet 1, cleaning up the nails from burning pallet scraps, spraying weeds and so many other things that it is hard to keep track of.

While I don't have specific numbers to back it up, I am sure Ron has more hours spent at the Shotgun Range than any other person that I know of. I can guarantee Ron has more hours on Skeet 1 than any other person, ever. Ron is synonymous with the #1 Skeet Field. Many years ago, we had a President of the Shotgun Range much wiser than myself. **Dave Otto** had the genius idea to dedicate Skeet 1 as Geiger Field way back in October of 2017 in honor of Ron and everything he did for Shotgun. I remember this because it was part of the very first Shotgun Newsletter that I ever wrote. The plaque is about halfway down the rock wall on the north end of the field. It is worth a visit and maybe a word of thanks to our friend Ron.

Ron was a consistent target of mine as I wrote the Shotgun Report over the years, most times he would take it in stride and we would laugh about it. Other times it would take a few weeks for him to resume talking to me. It's a moot point now, but never ever, ever, admit to messing with his settings on the sprinkler timer. That my friend gets you 4-5 weeks of the silent treatment. The number of people who have emailed me to share how Ron helped them at the Range goes to show just how special of a man Ron was.

If I had a minds eye picture of Ron it would be in the winter, him standing next to the fire barrel wearing his black down jacket with his shooting vest over the top of it. Hands in jacket pockets and wearing his perfectly placed ball cap, looking ready to shoot.

We are all going to miss Ron, he was easy to talk to and would always be the first person to help a new shooter learn the game of skeet he loved so much. Ron, like so many of our wonderful volunteers over the years, deserve countless accolades and many thanks for helping our little Shotgun Range be all It can be. In truth Ron probably deserves a book to be written about how much he has done for the Range. Being the humble man that he was, I am sure he'd be happy with all of us taking a moment to think of him.

How do we honor Ron as we move forward? One sure way we can all do that is to keep the Shotgun Range looking good through volunteering to help do all the things Ron did. One thing Ron always enjoyed was doing a project with others. When you look at all the time and effort he put in, it really is amazing one man did so much. If we can keep Shotgun looking as good as Ron did, I think he will be happy with all of us.

I am sure we will be coming up with another way to honor Ron and when we do, I will post it here and at the Shotgun Range.

It is a sad day when we lose someone we are close to. Take comfort in remembering all of the good times we had with Ron and know you can always visit him at **Geiger Field** which was established back in October of 2017. God speed Ron.
