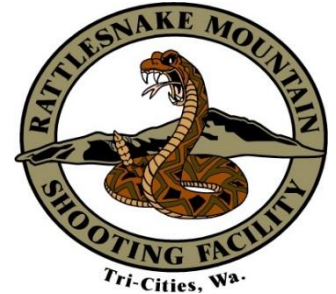

ROSE-IRIS BERMS

The berms at the 50 yard and 100-yard lines have been rebuilt on **both sides of the Rose-Iris Range House**. When you are setting targets at either location, please use the berm openings to approach the position for your target stand. If possible, use the sunken rails. They have been cleaned as well as could be. **PLEASE DO NOT WALK ON THE BERMS THEMSELVES. THIS HELPS PRESERVE THE BERMS.**

TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

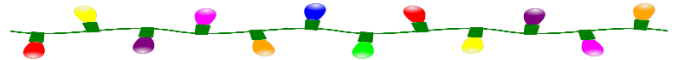

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it was loaded, control the direction of the muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and never carry two different cartridges or shotgun gauges.

CHIEF RSO REPORT

If you are not receiving any communications from TCSA or finding them in your spam/junk file, try adding "no.reply@tcsa.info" to your email contacts. That ".info" domain seems to trip a lot of spam filters.

Just wanted to remind everyone that **open carry and drawing from holsters is not allowed at the Rose-Iris and HESA Ranges**. Concealed firearms are fine, but must remain concealed. If you wish to shoot your concealed carry firearm, work with the duty RSO to safely bring it to the firing line and re-holster upon completion.

Shotguns may be fired at the Rose-Iris Range, and although I would expect mostly slugs and buckshot around hunting season, there are times when some bird shot pattern verification can be accomplished on the relatively small target backing provided there, so that is OK. If the goal is simply function firing a shotgun to test function or establish familiarity, please do not shred our target stands and backing. Select a safe aiming point down Range and have at it.

If you would like to really see what your shotgun is doing, we have a pattern board at the Shotgun Range that is available for use.

When placing targets at short range in the Rose-Iris 100 yard bays, please keep an eye on what is behind your target and move any stray target stands out of the way so they are not damaged.

We do not presently have an RSO Training Class on the calendar, but will schedule one whenever we have adequate interest. If you would like to become an RSO, send an email to Dan Martini at brandy.72396@gmail.com and he will contact you when we schedule a Class.

TCSA SMALLBORE RANGE STATUS

TCSA applied to the Recreation Conservation Office for a grant to assist with development of a new **105-Meter Smallbore Range**. The new Smallbore Range with 20 shooting stations developed has been completed. **Conrad Russell** built the Range and its one of the finest Smallbore Ranges in the Northwest.

The Range will start being used in the spring of 2025. This Range is designated for Smallbore Matches. A big advantage of this Range is that we will be able to schedule matches on weekends as well as the rest of the week. Scheduling on weekends should allow participation by more shooters. The original grant did not include money for an overhead canopy. TCSA is currently applying for another grant from the Recreation Conservation Office to build an overhead canopy along with shooting benches.

HIGH-POWER

Well, the end of the competition season is finally behind us. That means it is time to start planning for the next one! Match Directors please get your schedule requests to Mike asap, if you haven't already. The annual Schedule Meeting is planned for **December 7**, if you don't have the location information contact me or Mike.

I will also take a moment again to thank everyone at every club in the PNW who is responsible for scheduling matches, running matches and coordinating other range use. There are only a handful of ranges that run full yardage matches and only a handful of disciplines but it is amazing how much schedule conflict we have to resolve every year. Thanks to everyone who helps make all this happen!

The final Match Reports of the year start with the November 5 **50/100 Yard Dewar Match**. In spite of temperatures in the high 40°F's and wind 8-12 mph, gusting to 25 mph, the 9 hearty souls who shot turned in some excellent scores. **Brandon Tinker** led all shooters with the high card of 200-20X at 50 yards (**Mike Bunch, Phil Keuhlen, John Julian** and **Ron Jorgensen** also shot clean at 50 yards). Brandon was the only shooter to clean the 100-yard target. His 400-36X Aggregate not only won the Match, it is also the high aggregate for 2024 and a new all-time club record for the Dewar course of fire. Well done Brandon!

Next up was the November 8 **Vintage Smallbore Match**, which was a special request format. All shooters shot the Match with scopes. The weather was frigid, in the mid-30's at the start, but with very little wind throughout. Who would have thought that a 399-30X (99.75%) aggregate would turn out to be good enough for last place?! Congratulations to **Mike Bunch** who turned in two perfect 200-20X cards to win the high card and the Match. **Glen Buxton** introduced a "shoot the 0.25" dot" feature as a tiebreaker concept for next year and promptly got busted by it, eased into third place by **Brandon Tinker**, after both shot 400-39X. Every shooter except the Match Director cleaned both cards for a splendid finish to this series for 2024. Just goes to show that running the Match detracts from your shooting!

For the November 13 **50 Yard USBR Match**, Rattlesnake weather returned to form for the final bout against the "Green Monster" this year. The temperature was a nippy 40°, while the swirling winds between 9-15 mph (with a high gust of 32 mph) made conditions definitely sporty. **Mike Bunch** continued his late season dominance in this Match, winning the high card of 242-7X and the Match winning aggregate of 473-111X. Congratulations Mike!

Finally, the 2024 Smallbore Benchrest Season finished with the **50 Yard ARA Style Match**. 9 shooters turned out in slightly warmer conditions (50°), only to fight the worst winds of the year (16-32 mph, with a high gust of 39 mph). **Mike Bunch** won honors for the High Card, and also won the Match with an aggregate score of 4000-20X. Way to finish strong Mike!

We hope to see you all at many Matches next year!

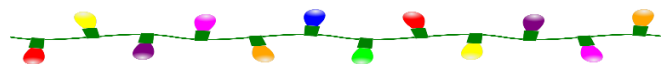

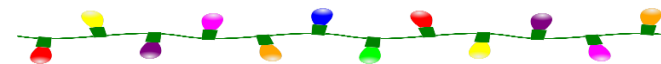
