TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

HUNTER EDUCATION AND SAFETY ASSOCIATION

As noted last month, our January -February 2025 Traditional Hunter



Education Class is scheduled. Classes will be held from **January 16** through **February 6.** The schedule is a little different this year because of classroom availability. Registration will open on **December 27**, and can be completed on the WDFW website. Class size will be limited to the first 20 students who register.

We anticipate a similar schedule of classes in 2025 as were held last year. After the Traditional Class, we are planning on offering evaluations for students who have completed the Online Course in March, April, and May. Another Traditional Class will be offered in June, followed by Online Evaluations in August and September.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it was loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and use the same safety rules when handling an air rifle as are used with other firearms.

SHOTGUN REPORT

Happy New Year everyone! 2024 has come to a close and we are onto 2025. In many ways 2024 was a pretty good year for the Shotgun Range and hopefully we keep the proverbial ball rolling in 2025.

With one more token count to go for the year the Shotgun Range is looking to end with just over 12,000 rounds thrown. Keeping in mind that a "round" for the Shotgun Range is (25) targets, meaning we threw in excess of 300,000 targets. That translates to 2223 cases or 33 pallets for the year. That makes for a lot of work loading all of those targets first into the storage building by the pallet, then into the trap and skeet houses by the case and finally by hand into all of the machines. And just because I like numbers, if we figure an average 1oz load per shot, we put approximately 9.5 tons or 19,000 lbs. of lead down range this year.

Trap was still the most popular game shot with a combined token count of over 7100 rounds thrown which is an increase of approximately 550 rounds over 2023. This can probably be attributed to the ever-popular Non-League Trap League and the Turkey and Christmas Shoots.

Skeet suffered a different fate in 2024 with a drop of just over 1000(!) rounds from 2023 numbers. This one is a bit perplexing. Honestly this drop in skeet rounds can probably also be attributed to the popularity of Non-League Trap League. We are looking to bring back the glory of Skeet League with monthly Non-League Skeet League Shoots in 2025. And hopefully a couple of Registered shoots as well.

5-Stand followed the trap numbers with the total round count being up by 140. 2023 was a bit of a slow year for 5-Stand, but **Rick Poehls** is on the job and looking to bring it back to the glory days of when the great **Phil Volkman** was in charge.

Back to the subject of the yearly numbers, all of the ranges were asked to figure the total number of volunteer hours it takes to run each of the disciplines for the year. This includes all of the RSO hours, mowing and lawn maintenance, target maintenance, administrative stuff, banking, machine maintenance, sprinklers, meetings, cleaning, printing materials, buying supplies, running shoots, etc., etc., etc. We tried our best to be accurate when we came up with just under 7000 volunteer hours for 2024. What does that number really mean? There are plenty of things to do around the Shotgun Range if you feel like lending a hand. It is not a complicated process to get started as it just takes showing up and offering to help.

It seems like months ago, but on December 15 we held the **Christmas Shoot**. The weather was fantastic this year and we had 57 shooters show up for the final **Fun & Games Shoot** of the year. Once again, we all owe **Chad** and **Paulyn Ungerecht** a heartfelt **THANK YOU** for all of the hard work they put into the preparation and running of these shoots. These shoots are a great way to get people to come out to the top-notch range we all enjoy.

This is the time of year to reflect and give thanks for things we have and that we may take for granted. The easy one is to be thankful for having such a nice range to shoot at each week. Being thankful for all of the volunteers that came before us and laid the groundwork for what we continue to improve upon today. Thankful for the Tri-Cities Shooting Association (TCSA) and all of the volunteers who keep pushing for new ranges, improvements and for keeping our administrative ducks in a row. Thankful for everyone who volunteers their time to be an RSO, mow the lawns, load machines, empty the garbage cans, set courses, run shoots, come up with good ideas, propose bad ideas, paint the yardages on the fields, start a fire on a cold day, share in a laugh, tell a story...or just come out and be a part of things.

Personally, I am most thankful for all of the friendships I have made at the Shotgun Range over the years. Many of whom I never would have met otherwise. Never would have shared hotels with for days on end at State Shoots, Regionals, Nationals and off the wall fun shoots. Shared a laugh while just sitting around the 5-Stand field or digging up a waterline that seemed buried way to deep. Trying to figure how to load string into the damn weed-eater. Troubleshooting a machine, loading targets, discussing things from the mundane to serious health issues. Meeting someone new or hearing the terrible news that we lost another of our friends to father time. It is part of the ride and I am thankful for all of it.

I enjoy talking about Shotgun, I enjoy working out there, writing these newsletters, sending out emails about the shoots and being around all of you. I enjoy shooting trap, skeet, 5-stand and any other type of game where a clay target is thrown in the air or on the ground for that matter.

Have questions? Hit me up, I also enjoy sharing my enthusiasm for shotgun sports.

If we have one objective for 2025, being a public range, is that we all need to strive to be welcoming and helpful to new shooters. Say hello to people you don't know, answer questions if you can and if you see someone doing something that's maybe not quite right, start with saying something and explaining a better or the safe way of doing things. Safety and shooting etiquette is on all of us. We were all new to the Shotgun Range at one point or another and sometimes we don't know, what we don't know. Likewise, if you are new to the Shotgun Range do not be afraid to ask questions. I promise if I look irritated it is only because I was trying to put string on that damn weed eater again.
