ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

HUNTER EDUCATION AND SAFETY ASSOCIATION

We had 18 students in our Traditional Hunter Ed Class that was completed on June 27. Our next **Traditional Class** will probably be in **January of 2025**.



We have evaluations for students who have completed the **Online Course** set up for **August 10, September 7** and **September 27**. Registration opens about three weeks before each session and can be done on the WDFW website. Classes typically fill up quickly in the fall, so if you need this Class, I would recommend you sign up the day it opens.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it was loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and store firearms and ammunition separately and securely.

NEXT RANGE SAFETY OFFICER CLASS

Our next 8-hour **Range Safety Officer Class** will be conducted on **Friday July 12** starting at 8 a.m. at the Shotgun Range House. If you can make that date, send me an e-mail message to <u>dantini@charter.net</u> with a YES and include your TCSA Membership number. I will add your name to the Class List and will send you a reminder message with all the details a week before the Class.

To become a TCSA Range Safety Officer, you need to be a current TCSA Member, attend the Friday 8-hour RSO Class and volunteer to do 3 Duty Days per year on a Wednesday, Friday, Saturday or Sunday at the Rose-Iris Range. You choose which three days you will be able to meet.

ADVANTAGES OF BEING A RSO

To become a TCSA RSO, you need to have and maintain your TCSA Membership, complete an 8-hour Class and volunteer to stand 3 days per year at the Rose-Iris General Purpose Range on a Wednesday, Friday, Saturday or Sunday. You choose which of those three days you will be able to meet.

The advantages of being a RSO and obligating yourself as a volunteer at TCSA means that on days when the Range is not open to the general public - YOU - as a RSO can use the Range. Having gone through the RSO Training Class and volunteering your time you are able to go to the Range any time you like!

Our next scheduled shoot will be **July 20** from 9:00 a.m. until noon.


COWBOY ACTION

SHOTGUN REPORT

Happy Fourth of July everyone! Wednesday evenings have been heating up, just like the weather. That's right if you want to come out and shoot a couple of rounds on Wednesday, Shotgun is open from 9:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. for the summer months.

I am happy to report the new voice calls have been working wonderfully. It really doesn't seem like they would make that big of a difference, but they do. Having calls that work almost every single time is something we are probably going to start taking for granted.

Everything is humming right along at Shotgun and we really appreciate everyone volunteering their time to our wonderful Range. We have a couple of housekeeping things to take care of in the way of what is acceptable at Shotgun and what is not.

- As a Range Safety Officer at Shotgun you are allowed to shoot on off days. You are also allowed to bring guests with you. If you bring guests who are not TCSA Members, they still must pay the \$10 Daily Use Fee. This is not negotiable. Yes, even if it's your uncle.
- Every single person that comes out to Shotgun needs to sign-in, whether they are shooting or not. It is so we can report how many people visit the Range to the Benton County Parks Board. It is not some nefarious tracking system.
- When you shoot on days the Range is not open, you still need to fill the machines just like any other day. The Range should always be left in a "Ready to open" state.
- If you wish to use the Shotgun Range House for an Event it must be approved and on the TCSA calendar. Please contact myself (email at end of this Shotgun Report) and I will point you in the right direction.
- Please do not adjust the machines outside of normal tolerances for throwing standard Trap and Skeet targets. If you do not know what those standards are, please do not adjust anything. If you have questions or would like to try something different, please ask so we do not damage the machines.
- Also, if you see, or hear something that doesn't seem right, let myself or another Shotgun Board member know. This can apply to the machines, sprinklers, toilets, safety issues, etc.

Remember we have a new **Shotgun RSO Scheduler**, **David Russie** for Shotgun. You can reach him at <u>roscheduler@tcsashotgun.com</u> if you have questions regarding RSO Scheduling days. **Russie** will be texting out reminders during the weeks to everyone that has duty coming up. If you are not sure of your duty days please get in contact with Russie. We depend on everyone working the days they signed up for. Thank you for volunteering your time at Shotgun, we do appreciate it.

A couple of things to remember when closing the Trap and Skeet houses.

- 1. Please make sure the machines are fully loaded and take all the cardboard boxes to the dumpster.
- 2. Be sure to release the throwing arms on all the machines. This is not only so that the machines are safe, it also helps preserve the throwing bands. If you have questions, please ask.
- 3. The chain across the road needs to be put up when the Range is closed.

Hero Volunteer of the Month is going to Rick Poehls for the month of July. Many of you know that Rick quit us to move to North Carolina a few years back. Well Rick quit that state as well and decided Washington was his one true love. Since moving back Rick has taken over machine maintenance on the 5-Stand field and he is actually doing a pretty good job of it. Thanks for coming back, Rick, we are mostly happy to see you!

If you take a new Membership, please remember to give out Temporary Membership cards to all new or renewing members. Please make sure they understand they will need to present the temporary card every time until they receive their permanent card in the mail. If they do not have either card they will have to pay the \$10 Daily Range Use Fee. We do not refund the \$10 fee at any time, for anyone.

Thank you to everyone for volunteering at the Shotgun Range. If you have the time, come out and enjoy shooting at this great Range of ours. Have a great month everyone and thank you again!

HIGH-POWER

Well hello summer, where the heck did you come from? I'm still trying to figure out how spring got here and suddenly it's 90° outside. This is a great time to remind everyone to exercise fire prevention discipline on the Range. Keep on the gravel roads, do not shoot steel core bullets at steel targets, no tracers, etc. I can tell you that the fire breaks work well, you do not need to test them for us!

July looks to be another busy month. On the Centerfire side of things, we've got a V2 Points Series Long Range Match on July 13 and a reduced yardage across the course match on July 14. This is a great Match to test the waters in across the course high-power, it is just a TCSA Match so no submittal of the scores to NRA or CMP and its reduced yardage (200 yards) so no need for special ammo etc. In fact, any center fire rifle that can hold 5 or more rounds and be reloaded with a box magazine or stripper clip will be able to hold its own in this Match.

On the Smallbore side of things, we've got a **50- and 100-Yard Dewar Match** on July 2, a **Vintage Smallbore** on July **4**, a **50 Yard USBR Smallbore** on July **9**, a **50 Yard ARA Smallbore** on July **11**, a **100/200 Smallbore Prone** on July **20**, a **Precision Rifle 22 Match** on July **21**, a **100 Yard Mini-Palma** on July **23**, and an ELR **22 Match** on July **27**. Note Smallbore is on their summer hours, everything **starts an hour earlier than last month**. **Don't be late** or they'll put you on relay 3, which fires next month!

Even with all that on the schedule, I count 3 weekend days and all 4 Fridays in July that are open. If you are a High-Power RSO and want to celebrate America's birthday by burning some powder you have several opportunities.

Looking back at June, by the time you read this the June 29 and 30 NRA RMC and CMP leg Match will have happened, but as I write this it is still a day away. I will have a shout out next month to whatever state junior team member (or coach) beat us all up this time.

On the Smallbore side of things, for the June 5 Dewar Match the forecasted heavy winds held off and 6 shooters enjoyed relatively favorable 62°F, partially overcast, 3-7 MPH conditions. **Glen Buxton** posted the high score for the season thus far, winning both the match and high card honors with a 399-28x. That's good shooting in any conditions or any discipline!

For the June 7 Vintage Smallbore Match, eight shooters found nearly ideal conditions on a Thursday morning, with clear skies, comfortable temperatures and light winds. The scores reflected it. **Glen Buxton** won the Match with a high score of 399-31X, {editor's note, see my comment about a 399-28x in the paragraph above and draw your own conclusion about a 399-31x from there} while **Mike Bunch** and **Tom Walchuck** tied for the high card honors, both turning in a second card of 200-17X. **Ron Jorgensen** shot two clean targets, but his scope handicap dropped him way down the standings. **Larry Meerdink** also had an excellent day, one point behind Ron, but was similarly roughed up by the scope handicap.

For the June 1 50-Yard USBR 22 Match, wind returned to the Rattlesnake Mountain Shooting Facility, as it seems to do often. The temperature was pleasant, averaging 70°F over the Match, while winds varied from 5-10 mph quartering from the shooters' left rear to right front. Junior shooter **Merrick Gardner** joined us for his first go at the "Green Monster" and we hope to see him back during the summer. **Mike Bunch** won the Match and honors for the high card. His 481-10X aggregate becomes the highest score for this Match thus far in 2024, while his 241-10X ranks as the highest card so far this year. Way to go Mike!

For the June 13 50 Yard ARA 22 Match, calm winds, clear skies, and comfortable temperatures prevailed. Only shooter skills, ammo consistency and equipment determined the outcome of the Match. **Ben Cook** was the Match and high card winner and set a new high card record for the year to date with a 2250-11x. This outing also afforded some lessons learned/comic relief.

Lesson Learned 1:

Q: What is the function of the knurled knob on the back of a Suhl 150 bolt?

A: It is NOT the safety. It does function as the retaining element for all the bolt parts, and when turned and not controlled will spew them everywhere. There are few things funnier than 4 old guys searching the firing line on hands and knees in search of a tiny bolt plunger spring, unless it is the same 4 guys trying to figure out how all the parts have to be oriented to go together and restore functionality!

Lesson Learned 2:

Q: What is worse than firing two shots into a record bull on the ARA unlimited target?

A: Not rechecking your target before completing it, only to find out when scoring starts that you skipped an entire row of bulls and handicapped the card by 500 possible points right off the top!

That is entertainment! {Editor's note: it also goes to show that even the most experienced have bad days sometimes and the eventual winner isn't necessarily the shooter who can hold the hardest or read the wind the best, it's often the shooter who makes the least mistakes!}
