TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it was loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and unload firearms when they are not in use.

ADVANTAGES OF BEING A RSO

To become a TCSA RSO, you need to have and maintain your TCSA Membership, complete an 8-hour Class and volunteer to stand 3 days per year at the Rose-Iris General Purpose Range on a Wednesday, Friday, Saturday or Sunday. You choose which of those three days you will be able to meet.

The advantages of being a RSO and obligating yourself as a volunteer at TCSA means that on days when the Range is not open to the general public - YOU - as a RSO can use the Range. Having gone through the RSO Training Class and volunteering your time you are able to go to the Range any time you like!

NEW .22 LONG RIFLE SMALL BORE RANGE DEVELOPMENT

The development of the new **Smallbore Range** is currently underway and a lot of progress has been made. The development of the new Range requires moving several feet of soil and rock to create berms on three sides of the Range and to level the area of the Range. The first two feet of digging went well. Unfortunately, the developer ran into a sediment called caliche. **Caliche** is a sedimentary rock, a hardened natural cement of calcium carbonate that binds other materials—such as gravel, sand, clay and silt and is very hard to dig. This has slowed progress, but it is anticipated that by the end of June we should be looking at a new Range. We have purchased a new Conex that has been delivered to the site for storage of match supplies and equipment.

HIGH-POWER

With Memorial Day behind us, we are "officially" into the summer months. This means lots of shooting of course, but it also means it is time for extra vigilance on the Range. We don't want to test the fire break, and we do not want to have to haul someone to the ER with heat exhaustion. Make sure when you load up to go to the range to pack your water, sunscreen, etc., and make sure to keep fire safety in mind especially with where you are parking or driving.

June kicks off on the Centerfire side of things with a V2 Points Series Long Range Match on the June 1, followed by a 300 Yard Open Any Rifle on the 15th and ends with an NRA approved RMC on the 29th and a CMP Leg Match on the 30th. If you are looking to make some headway toward your Distinguished badge or boost your classification, this is your last chance until September.

On the smallbore side of things, we have a **50/100 Yard Dewar Match** on the **4**th, a **Vintage Smallbore** on the **6**th, a **100/200 Yard Match** on the **9**th, a **50 Yard USBR Smallbore** on the **11**th, a **50 Yard ARA Smallbore** on the **13**th, a **PR-22 Match** on the **23**rd and a **100 Yard Mini Palma** on the **25**th to round out the month.

Looking back at May, we had a Long-Range Regional Match on the 3rd - 5th, with a little excitement for those who attended in the form of wind. Have you ever looked through your scope and watched your buddy's target go cartwheeling across the range - the whole 6-foot square target and backer board? We stopped shooting on Saturday after the northwest wind broke one target frame's uprights and blew off four other target faces. As Sunday's forecast looked to be more ominous, only 10 shooters stayed on to finish the Match. Although a little rainy, Sunday's southwest 15-mph wind was less impactful than Saturday's 28+ mph gusts. In the end, Spokane's Daniel Maple bested the F-Open shooters with a 983-35X. This was Daniel's first Rattlesnake Long Range victory capped by Sunday's impressive scores of 199-9X, 199-6X, and 198-8X. Following Daniel were Ted Wedell in second with 979-37X and Joe Traylor in third with 977-39X. Mike Sowa took the F-Target Rifle win with 944-20X. Bill Brown finished in second, 938-14, and third, Charlie Chan with 935-17X.

On the 11th we had a **Regional Match Course**, with Benton City's **Adam Maxwell** besting the field with a 768-26x. Spokane's **James Patterson** was second with a 767-17x. For those with a keen memory you will note that is two matches this year that James has lost by just 1 point. That is extremely rare here at Rattlesnake! **Dave Baalman** wound up third with a 755-11x. On the smallbore side we had a **50/100 Yard Dewar Match** on the 7th, which was contested under clear skies with temperatures in the 50's. The wind started out fairly steady at about 10 mph across the course on the first relay but became more challenging on the second relay shifting back and forth between a 15-mph head wind and a 10mph crossing wind. **Jeff Davis** picked up the late adjustments best and won the match with a score of 393-17X. **Brandon Tinker** gave Jeff a run for his money and shot the only clean card of the match, 200-13X at 50 yards for the high card honors.

There was a **Vintage Small Bore Match** on the 11th, with some superb shooting on display. All shooters scored 96% or better! **Brandon Tinker** won the Match and had the high card score of 200-8X. **Larry Meerdink** had a double clean raw score (200-11X/200-13X) but the scope handicap dropped him out of contention for top spot/high card honors.

May 14, we held a **50-Yard USBR Match**, which was contested in bright, temperate conditions. However, once again, variable winds made the "Green Monster" one of the more challenging targets for TCSA shooters. Only **Ben Cook, Mike Bunch** and **Tom Halecki** posted aggregate scores north of 90%, and X's were rare as hens teeth. Congratulations to **Ben Cook** who won the Match with a score of 475-4X and honors for the high card of 241-1X.

At the **50-Yard ARA Style Match** on the 17th, although the skies were fair and the temperature pleasant, the sporty Rattlesnake winds depressed participation and scores. **Tom Halecki** was the sole competitor to break 2000 on any card, winning the match with an aggregate of 3835-7X and the award for high card with a score of 2050-4X.

SHOTGUN REPORT

Shotgun is now open until 7:00 p.m. on Wednesdays during the summer months. Come on out after work and shoot a couple rounds. We will be opening 5-Stand on Wednesday afternoons and maybe shooting some fun and games on the trap field. Either way, targets should be flying.

Last month we had the new voice calls on the Trap fields, and this month we have a new system on the main Skeet field as well as a new wireless system on the 5-Stand field. That's right, there are a lot of new things to come check out at the Shotgun Range.

The new voice calls on the Skeet field operate very similar to our old system, with a few minor differences.

- The main controller is now Red and has (4) buttons on it. Hi House, Low House, Doubles, and then there is a Red colored button to use the button in Manual mode.
- To shoot by yourself utilizing the voice call system you need to turn on the voice box by pushing the circular power button on top of the red voice box.
- Then use the hand controller to select the target presentation and call "Pull". Or whatever word you'd like to use. When you call pull the first bird will be thrown and then the system will advance to the next bird on report of your gun.
- To throw birds manually, when in a group, it works just like the old system. EXCEPT, you need to <u>PUSH & HOLD the</u> <u>Red button until it BEEPS</u> and the little led light stays on. Likewise, to switch back to the voice call, you will need to PUSH & HOLD the Red Button until it beeps and the led light turns off.

We also have a new wireless system in place on the 5-Stand Field. While the old system worked pretty well, the new controller helps to simplify things and make it easier to move machines around. The main controller allows a wide range of options that will help run 5-Stand a little more efficiently. All of this means 5-Stand is open once again and we will be throwing targets on Wednesday afternoons (4:30ish) if we have interest and Sunday mornings (9:00 a.m. start).

While we are on the topic of new, the Shotgun Range has a new RSO Scheduler. The **Great Chris Quinton** accepted a job in Dallas, Texas and has made the move South. We all owe Chris a debt of gratitude for doing an amazing job as RSO Scheduler for the past 4 years. Honestly it probably involves the most work and organization of all the volunteer positions at Shotgun. Fortunately, we were only absent a RSO Schedule for about a week when **David Russie** volunteered to take over position. After an exhaustive interview process and spelling bee the Shotgun Board approved Russie for the job. Which means if you have issues, questions, or scheduling requests, you can contact Russie at <u>roscheduler@tcsashotgun.com</u>.

Russie will be texting out reminders during the weeks to everyone that has duty coming up. If you are not sure of your duty days please get in contact with Russie. We depend on everyone working the days they signed up for. Thank you for volunteering your time at Shotgun, we do appreciate it.

A couple of things to remember when closing the Trap and Skeet houses.

- 1. Please make sure the machines are fully loaded and take all the cardboard boxes to the dumpster.
- 2. Be sure to release the throwing arms on all the machines. This is not only so that the machines are safe, it also helps preserve the throwing bands. If you have questions, please ask.
- 3. Do not adjust the machines unless you are sure of what you are doing. Damage to the machines can occur.
- 4. The chain across the road needs to be put up when the range is closed.

Hero Volunteer of the Month is going to Phil Volkman for taking the time to get 5-Stand up and running this year. We are going with a simpler layout this year, sticking with 6 or 8 machines per course. This cuts down on the number of targets that need to be learned per course which doesn't sound like much, but it does make it an easier game to learn.

With Membership Renewal season still going strong please remember to give out Temporary Membership cards to all new members. Please make sure they understand they will need to present the temporary card every time until they wait for their permanent card to come in the mail.

Thank you to everyone for volunteering at the Shotgun Range. If you have the time, come out and enjoy shooting at this great range of ours.
