TCSA FACILITIES

ROSE-IRIS RANGE – A 100-yard range with 20 covered firing points. This day use Range Safety Officer supervised facility is operated for public use on a regularly scheduled basis Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.

RIMFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard 22-caliber Range Safety Officer supervised Shooting Range with reactive targets.

CENTERFIRE PLINKING RANGE – A 50-yard handgun pistol/revolver RSO supervised range with reactive targets for firearms using black powder or standard pistol cartridges.

COWBOY / PRACTICAL PISTOL BAYS – Ranges consisting of 13 bays of varying lengths designed to support a variety of action shooting disciplines such as; Practical (IPSC/ USPSA) 3-Gun Sports and Cowboy (SASS) groups.

1000-YARD, HIGH-POWER RANGE – A Range consisting of 100, 200, 300, 600, 800, 900 & 1000-yard firing lines that can support 20 firing stations on each firing line (utilizes manned target operation). The 400-yard line has 5 firing stations and the 500-yard line has 10 firing stations. This Range supports High-Power Rifle, Long Range PALMA and Precision Shooting Events of various disciplines, including 50-Caliber.

HUNTER EDUCATION RANGE: This Range has been designed to support Hunter Education Training Classes and also has a practical field exercise area containing obstacles hunters could expect to encounter in the field. The covered firing line can be used independently by current RSO's as an overflow from the Rose-Iris Range and may be available for RSO supervised public event use when not being used for the conduct of Hunter Education Classes.

Our spring schedule of Online Evaluations is all set up. We will offer the one-day



evaluations for students who have completed the online portion of the hybrid course on March 15, April 5, April 26 and May 10. Registration will be done on the WDFW website and are listed as "Richland Recreation." Registration will open about three weeks before the class date. I expect the classes to fill up very quickly, probably within 24 hours. We also anticipate offering these evaluations in August and September.

I nearly have our **June Traditional Class** set up and expect to have that complete by the time this Newsletter comes out. It is scheduled to run from **June 16** through **July 3**. Registration will likely open the last week of May, and like our online evaluations, our traditional classes have been filling up quickly.

RSOs using the HESA Range are expected to sign in at the Rose-Iris Range before going over to the HESA Range to shoot. You are also expected to clean up when you are done shooting, including returning target stands to the Rose-Iris Range House and picking up brass.

Always remember to treat every firearm as if it was loaded, control the direction of your muzzle, be sure of your target and what lies beyond it, keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot and never use a firearm unless you are familiar with how it works.

The advantages of being a RSO and obligating yourself as a volunteer at TCSA means that on days when the Range is not open to the general public - YOU - as a RSO can use the Range. Having gone through the RSO Training Class and volunteering your time you are able to go to the Range any time you like!

To become a TCSA RSO, you need to have and maintain your TCSA Membership, complete an 8-hour Class and volunteer to stand 3 days per year at the Rose-Iris General Purpose Range on a Wednesday, Friday, Saturday or Sunday. You choose which of those three days you will be able to meet.

HIGH-POWER

Winter is (supposedly) almost over and with anticipated spring weather comes competition season! If you are new to Rattlesnake, I will throw out one big tip for the spring conditions: be sure to put a big old rock on the upwind corner of your shooting mat, or you will have to go pick it up behind the berm after the Match ends!

Our new **Smallbore Range** is all ready to go! Our first scheduled event will be a **Youth Smallbore Event** in **April.** If you are interested in volunteering or if you have a youngster who is interested in smallbore, contact **Phil Keuhlen** (509.366.6070) or **Dave McNeal** (509.366.6879).

Across the course competition kicks off in March with the Korean War Memorial Service Rifle Match March 1 and 2. There is a special award for the top M-1 Garand in this one, so dig that "Greatest Battle Implement" out of the back of the safe and come join us. If you don't have an M-1 (or can't stomach the thought of shooting it across the course for 2 days) any service rifle will put you in competition. If you just want to come out and play with a match rifle there will be room for you on the line with it as well. The rest of the month centerfire wise incudes a 600 Yard Mid-Range Match on March 7, a Long Range V2 Match March 8 and a 1MOA Steel 1000 Yard Match on March 16.

On the smallbore side of things, we have got a 50-100 Yard Dewar Match on March 4, Vintage Smallbore on March 6, 100/200 Yard Smallbore on March 9, 50 Yard USBR Smallbore on March 11, 50 Yard ARA Smallbore on March 13, an ELR 22 Steel Match on March 22 and a 100 Yard Mini-Palma Match on March 25. We also have a NRL 22 Rimfire Match on March 1 and a PRS22 Rimfire Match on March 2 both at the HESA Range.
